The University of Pittsburgh School of Law is offering several fellowships for students working in unpaid internship positions through the Semester in DC Program this academic year. These fellowships are stipends that are intended to mitigate additional expenses associated with participating in the Semester in DC Program and do not constitute payment for the internship work.

To be considered for a Semester in DC Program Fellowship, students <u>must take the following steps</u>:

- 1. <u>Secure a position</u> that meets the Semester in DC Program requirements and has been approved by Professor Baylis through the usual Semester in DC Program procedures. (We recognize that some employers make their hiring decisions at the last minute. If you are still waiting to hear from a potential employer as the deadline approaches, email Professor Baylis at <a href="mailto:pittindc@pitt.edu">pittindc@pitt.edu</a> as early as possible, but in any event in advance of the deadline.)
- 2. Read, complete, and sign this application.
- 3. Write a one-page, double-spaced <u>essay</u> of no more than 250 words explaining how this financial support will aid the student and how the Semester in DC Program internship will advance your career plans.
- 4. If you are applying for the Samuelson/Glushko Fellowship, write an additional paragraph explaining how your internship will enable you to work on IP/tech law matters.

5. Submit this application form, your essay, and your <u>resume</u> via email to <u>pittindc@pitt.edu</u> by November 30 for the following spring semester.

To be eligible for a Semester in DC Program fellowship, students <u>must also agree to be</u> bound by, and <u>must fully comply with, the following restrictions</u>:

- 1. Students may receive additional financial aid or outside funding that is tied to their Semester in DC Program positions; however, the total amount received, including this fellowship, may not exceed the Semester in DC Program stipend cap of \$4,500.
- 2. Students must complete all the requirements of the Semester in DC Program during the semester in which they receive their fellowships. Failure to complete those requirements will result in forfeiture of the fellowship.

By signing below, I agree that I have read this document, understand its requirements and restrictions, and agree to be bound by and comply with those requirements and restrictions. I also affirm that all of the information included in my application packet is true, correct, and complete. I further understand that failure to exhibit honesty or to respect the ethical standards of the legal profession at any point in the application process or, if I receive a fellowship, during the Semester in DC Program employment supported by the stipend, will result in my being sanctioned under the Law School's Standards of Academic Integrity.
